Course instruction will include, traffic safety, basic traffic laws, vehicle maintenance, vehicle control, and tips on buying/owning a vehicle. Also during the course of the class, various guest speakers will address students including representatives from local law enforcement, fire & rescue, an insurance agency, an auto repair business, and Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD). The classroom phase of the program includes 30 hours of instruction and State law requires that there be a maximum of two absences allowed during the classroom session. Because of this, absences will only be permitted for emergency situations with written verification from the student's parent or guardian. Absences in excess of state law or not in compliance with the absence policy may result in removal from the program. State law also requires students to be enrolled in a Behind The Wheel class before the forms necessary to obtain a temporary state permit can be obtained. These forms are required by the Department of Motor Vehicles in addition to successfully passing a short exam before a temporary state permit can be obtained.

Behind The Wheel instruction will also be available for those who have enrolled in the classroom session. These sessions will be scheduled at the mutual convenience of the student and Pro Active Driving School Inc. and can begin as soon as the student has turned 15 ½ years old. The State of Wisconsin requires that Behind The Wheel training consists of six, two hour sessions. These sessions will include one hour of student instruction, and one hour observing another student driver. Students must possess their temporary state permit in order to start Behind The Wheel training.
